

# ARTS CLUB THEATRE COMPANY REVEALS 60<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY SEASON LINEUP

# TOURS AND ARTISTIC INITIATIVES ALSO ANNOUNCED

**IN BRIEF** The Arts Club Theatre Company's 2023–2024 season kicks off in September with programming at all three venues: the <u>Stanley Industrial Alliance Stage</u>, the <u>Granville Island Stage</u>, and the <u>Newmont Stage at the BMO Theatre Centre</u>. Subscription packages are available now at <u>artsclub.com</u> or by calling 604.687.1644. The 5-show Stanley Series, the most popular subscription, starts at just \$132. Single tickets will go on sale to the general public in June.

VANCOUVER, B.C. (February 28, 2023)—Today, the Arts Club Theatre Company's Artistic Director Ashlie Corcoran and Executive Director Peter Cathie White announced the 2023–2024 season programming for Western Canada's leading non-profit theatre organization, celebrating the company's 60<sup>th</sup> season with an exciting lineup of shows.

In honour of this diamond anniversary, Corcoran said, "The Arts Club has a history—and a future—of never being content with the status quo and of always striving forward from its founding to today. As we approach our 60 years of existence, our goal is for each show to deepen our commitment to artists in our province, highlight conscious eclecticism, aim for the highest levels of artistic excellence, and reflect our community's diversity."

Cathie White added, "Over the next 60 years, we will continue to support the development of local theatrical voices while also strengthening the Arts Club's reputation as a nationally renowned theatre company that deeply and richly engages with its community. With artistic visioning, organizational readiness, and financial stability working hand in hand, the Arts Club's position as the principal gathering place for participation in the arts in Vancouver—for audiences, artists, and the community at large—will continue to flourish."

The 2023–2024 season will kick off in September at the Arts Club's flagship venue, the Stanley Industrial Alliance Stage, with the devouring horror musical *Little Shop of Horrors*, a co-production with the Citadel Theatre. Four other shows are also programmed for the Stanley: *Elf: The Musical*, a gleeful holiday present based on the beloved film; *Choir Boy*, a co-production with Canadian Stage of the Tony Award–nominated coming-of-age story; *Red Velvet*, the true story of **Ira Aldridge**, the first Black actor to play Othello in London; and the romantic musical comedy *Guys & Dolls*, a cool summer treat to beat the heat.

The Arts Club's longtime waterfront home, the Granville Island Stage, will see the return of the hugely popular *Mom's the Word: Talkin' Turkey* over the holidays. Three other shows will follow: the hilarious *Father Tartuffe: An Indigenous Misadventure,* co-produced with Touchstone Theatre; *Sexy Laundry*, a touching romantic comedy about rediscovering love, by Vancouver playwright Michele Riml; and *Ring of Fire*, Johnny Cash's remarkable life story told through his music.

In addition, Corcoran announced the three shows programmed for the Newmont Stage at the BMO Theatre Centre. The world premiere of *Someone Like You*, a millennial take on *Cyrano de Bergerac* by Vancouver-based playwright **Christine Quintana**, will open the season at the company's Olympic Village venue. Two other shows that were delayed due to the pandemic will follow: *Every Brilliant Thing*, an immersive exploration into the small joys of being human; and the Canadian premiere of *Cambodian Rock Band*, the captivating play about the power of music and the resiliency of family.

To honour the six decades since Arts Club's inception, the company also announced it will commission six <u>Silver Commissions</u>, an unprecedented groundswell of new play activity. Titles will be announced at a later date.



The Arts Club will also be reviving its Lower Mainland and provincial tours. The 2023–2024 tour will be the first since the COVID-19 pandemic. Tour details will be announced at a later date.
