VANCOUVER, B.C. (December 14, 2023)—Experience an inspiring Canadian story told through song in Beau Dixon's *Beneath Springhill: The Maurice Ruddick Story*, touring **January 5–February 4** across the Lower Mainland and B.C.

Trapped 4,000 feet underground with no food, little air, and even less hope of survival, the indomitable spirit and song of coal miner Maurice Ruddick (**Jeremiah Sparks**) served as a lifeline for his fellow miners over nine unimaginable days. This is the true story of the African-Canadian "singing miner" that emerged from the 1958 Springhill, Nova Scotia, mining disaster. A remount of the Arts Club's successful 2021 production at the Granville Island Stage, this award-winning one-person show recalls the tense historic events and celebrates hope, courage, and community.

Artistic Director **Ashlie Corcoran** said, "What makes the piece work so well is its determined optimism and celebration of the power of community. We are thrilled to be remounting it for our local tour."

Beau Dixon is an award-winning actor, musician, playwright, music director, and sound designer based in Ontario, Canada. He is the co-founder and artistic director for Firebrand Theatre, a Canadian educational theatre company. His award-winning play, *Beneath Springhill: The Maurice Ruddick Story*, garnered him a Calgary Critic's Award for Best Individual Performance and two Dora Mavor Moore Awards for Best New Play and Best Individual Performance. In 2021, he was curator and music director for the Stratford Festival's production of *Freedom: The Spirit and Legacy of Black Music*. Recently, Beau became the music director for Sheridan College and Lakefield College School. Currently, Beau is









working on a variety of projects, including acting in film and TV roles, producing and writing plays, and composing and performing music for digital distribution, public live stream events, and corporate functions.
