ARTS CLUB THEATRE COMPANY ANNOUNCES CAST AND CREATIVE TEAM FOR CHOIR BOY

VANCOUVER, B.C. (January 4, 2024)—A hit coming-of-age play threaded with rapturous gospel hymns, *Choir Boy* plays Jan 25–Feb 25 at the Arts Club Theatre Company's Stanley Industrial Alliance Stage.

Pharus (**Andrew Broderick**) is a senior at the Charles R. Drew Prep School for Boys, and the proud leader of its legendary gospel choir. The prestigious school is committed to building "strong, ethical Black men," but conforming to their traditions becomes harder as he learns to accept his identity as a young gay man. Weighing reconciliation and rebellion and featuring gorgeously sung a cappella hymns, *Choir Boy* is a love letter from **Tarell Alvin McCraney**, the Academy Award—winning screenwriter of *Moonlight*, to the healing power of music.

Director **Mike Payette** said, "Tarell Alvin McCraney's writing invokes a unique harmony of poetry and contemporary prose through a powerful backdrop of community and coming-of-age. The journey of this brotherhood is celebrated through its complications and discoveries and reminds of the human need to belong and let our voice rise. The talents of the artists lift this story to spiritual heights, and the piece is one that will resonate in our hearts and souls long after the final bow."

Ashlie Corcoran, the Arts Club's Artistic Director, added, "Starring 'Canadian Idol' competitor Andrew Broderick, this coming-of-age piece explores contrasting representations of Black masculinity—something often not represented in popular media. I'm so excited for our audience to experience playwright Tarell Alvin McCraney's finely wrought scenes and the piece's gorgeously harmonized gospel music."

Prior to the Arts Club's co-production with Canadian Stage, *Choir Boy* was produced at the Royal Court, the Manhattan Theatre Club, the Geffen Playhouse in Los Angeles, and on Broadway at the Samuel J. Friedman Theatre. In 2019, it was nominated for four Tony Awards, including Best Play.

Tarell Alvin McCraney is an acclaimed writer. His script *In Moonlight Black Boys Look Blue* is the basis for the Oscarwinning film *Moonlight*, directed by Barry Jenkins, for which McCraney and Jenkins won an Oscar for Best Adapted Screenplay. He wrote the film *High Flying Bird*, directed by Steven Soderbergh, which premiered on Netflix. McCraney's plays include *Ms. Blakk for President* (co-written with Tina Landau), *The Brother/Sister Plays* trilogy, *Head of Passes*, *Wig Out!*, and *Choir Boy*. McCraney's numerous awards include the Whiting Award, Steinberg Playwright Award, Doris Duke Artist Award, Windham-Campbell Prize, London Evening Standard Award for Most Promising Playwright, New York Times Outstanding Playwright Award, the Paula Vogel Award, and a 2013 MacArthur Fellowship.
