VANCOUVER, B.C. (January 15, 2024)—Find joy in life's intricacies in *Every Brilliant Thing*, playing February 8–March 3 at the Arts Club Theatre Company's Newmont Stage at the BMO Theatre Centre.

What do you do when you're just seven years old and mum finds it hard to be happy? Start writing down for her every brilliant thing worth living for—ice cream, water fights, rollercoasters—and then never stop. #315 The smell of old books. #994 Hairdressers who listen to what you want. #2000 Coffee. #9996 Sex. As time passes and the list grows, what began as a naive attempt to deal with tragedy becomes an epic chronicle of life's small joys. This list takes on a life of its own in an unusually funny show about depression and love.

Starring in this solo show is **Naomi Wright**, who has been nominated for eight Jessie Awards, two Dora Awards, and a SATA award for her work on Canadian stages. The audience, a key element of the story, is kindly invited to add to the list or step in as a character, which illustrates the power of community.

The Arts Club's Artistic Director, **Ashlie Corcoran**, who is directing this show, said, *"Every Brilliant Thing* lifts spirits, buoys belief in humankind, and creates wonder about the minutiae of daily life. It's sweet, simple *and* complex, and full of meaning. It's one of the best examples I have experienced of gentle audience participation, and it's perfect for our most intimate theatre."

Originally performed at the 2014 Edinburgh Fringe Festival, *Every Brilliant Thing* was such an enormous hit that it was invited for a four-month run in New York City. During its run at the Barrow Street Theatre in New York, it was filmed for broadcast on HBO.

Duncan Macmillan is a former Writer-in-Residence at Paines Plough and Manchester Royal Exchange. His plays include the acclaimed adaptation of George Orwell's *1984*, co-adapted/co-directed with Robert Icke; *Every Brilliant Thing*; *2071*, co-written with Chris Rapley; and *Monster*. He was the recipient of two awards in the inaugural Bruntwood Playwriting Competition (2006). Other awards include Best New Play at the Off West End Awards (2013) for *Lungs*, the Big Ambition Award, Old Vic (2009), and the Pearson Prize (2008). His work with director Katie Mitchell has been selected for Theatertreffen and the Avignon Festival.

Jonny Donahoe is the co-creator and original performer of the acclaimed worldwide smash *Every Brilliant Thing*, which he performed over 400 times across four continents. Donahoe's comedy act, *Jonny and the Baptists*, tours regularly throughout Britain and the rest of the world. His stage plays include *Thirty Christmases*, which opened at The Old Fire Station in Oxford, and then transferred the following year off West End to the New Diorama. He is currently adapting this play for TV. Donahoe has made a podcast series with his real-life partner, Josie Long, called *Josie & Jonny Are Having a Baby (With You!)*, and another with Paddy Gervers called *Making Paddy Happy*.
