On the eve of a solar eclipse, shy Seymour (**Tenaj Williams**) stumbles upon a plant that changes his life. Naming it after his crush, Seymour quickly discovers that Audrey Two is no ordinary succulent—this ferocious fern feeds on the blood of humans. To achieve fame and capture the attention of the plant's namesake, the young florist must curb the plant's appetite by continuing the kill—but at what cost? Deliciously hilarious, this retro rom-com is jam-packed with the perfect soundtrack to welcome the 60th anniversary of the Arts Club Theatre Company.

Arts Club's Artistic Director **Ashlie Corcoran** will direct the production that kicks off the 2023–2024 season. Of the show, Corcoran said, "The nostalgia for this classic piece is strong. *Little Shop of Horrors* features incredibly catchy music, sharply drawn characters, and a sense of silliness and sly humour. There is a reason it is often cited by folks as their favourite musical—it's definitely one of mine!"

The Arts Club's co-production with the Citadel Theatre, Edmonton, includes an entirely Western Canadian cast hailing from Edmonton, Calgary, and Vancouver. There will be several familiar faces to Arts Club audiences, including Tenaj Williams as Seymour and **Synthia Yusuf** as Audrey. The show will feature choreography by **Gianna Vacirca** and musical direction by **Caitlin Hayes**.

Little Shop of Horrors was nominated for several awards between 1983 and 2020, including the 1983 Laurence Olivier Award for Musical of the Year and the 1984 Grammy Award for Best Musical Theatre Album.
