I never imagined I would lose my father the way that I did. I never conceived of the grief my mother would feel and the path she would set herself on to find her way back. I never imagined I would be so moved that I would be compelled to write this story down and try to share it with all of you.

And yet here I am. Here we are. Humans together in the theatre. In the fading shadow of a worldwide pandemic. All trying to find our own way back. Not to an old life we used to inhabit, but something new and unknown.

Because, as Joan Didion articulates so clearly and concisely, that's what life is. An experience that is both maddeningly ordinary and astonishingly surreal.

I hope that watching this play, that something rings true for you. That you take hope from it. That it opens a little crack somewhere in the back of your mind where an idea hides. To do something extraordinary and brave. And that you do it.

Huge love and thanks to Ashlie Corcoran and Peter Cathie White for believing in this story and trusting me to bring it to Arts Club audiences, in collaboration with this astonishing actor, Susinn, and this incredibly talented creative team. I am so grateful for all that each of you brought: your heart, your craft, your artistry, and your care.

AN INTERVIEW WITH MIEKO OUCHI

Burning Mom is based on an extraordinary true story—and an extraordinarily personal one for playwright and director Mieko Ouchi. The Mom of the play's title is based on her own mother, who indeed did make a cross-border "pilgrimage" (as Ouchi put it) in her RV to the countercultural Burning Man festival in Nevada. In anticipation of the Arts Club's production of Burning Mom, which Ouchi is directing, she discussed the process of writing and developing this unique play, its real-life inspiration, and what she hopes others find in seeing it performed on stage.

Arts Club: Can you speak a bit about the origins of this play and what inspired you?

Mieko Ouchi: Well, this play really grew out of a tragedy in my family, which was the very sudden and unexpected passing of my father in 2010. He was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. At Christmas time he wasn't feeling well, and after a huge round of tests, we were told the shocking news that he had six months to live, which seemed unimaginable, and then he passed away about three weeks later. So, it was a devastating event in our family. Of course, we were all heartbroken, but none more so than my mother, who had married my dad when she was 19. She had spent her entire adult life with him, and she was just so lost. Me and my brothers spent the year following that helping her find her way back into just sort of being alone and dealing with so many things that my dad had always done, the many life-things that you do as a partner and you don't think about until the person is gone.

We got through that really tough first year, and at the end of the year my mom called my brothers and me into the family room. She said, "Oh my goodness, we've had such a horrible year—I really think that we should go on a family trip together." And in that moment, all I could think of was, like, some sort of an all-inclusive in Mexico where people would bring me drinks. Then my mother said, "I think we should go to Burning Man." And we kind of sat there. All I can describe is a stunned silence. This was not something that you would expect from my mother. My mother was not the kind of person you would look at and say, "Oh, that's a natural fit." It was a shock.

The following weeks were a journey of discovery about what had inspired her to go. It turned out that it was this thing that she felt compelled to do because my dad had mentioned it once. After my brother had gone to Burning Man, he said one time, "We should go to Burning Man." Somehow that stuck in my mother's head, then came back to her all this time later in the midst of her grief. Then what happened was that she went —and I don't think she even put it in these kind of terms—on a pilgrimage.

It was a life-changing experience, and the play and the story really grew out of me witnessing the change that it made in her and in all of us. It came out of her telling the story. She started telling the story at grief support groups that she was part of and to family and friends, and everybody was so moved by it. I'm even getting moved talking about it. It really inspired me to think, "Is there a wider audience that I can share this story with?" Because the story actually isn't a story of grief-it's actually a story of hope and finding your way back to the joy in your life. And whoa, can't we all use a roadmap for that? We all have a use for that, right? Especially after COVID—I started writing this just before COVID hit—I thought even more about why a story like this might be needed. We were all kind of trying to find our way back to joy in life again, and also realizing that we couldn't go back to life the way it used to be. It was going to be a new normal. And I think that's actually what my mom was grappling with, in that decision to make this life-changing trip.

AC: Did you ever attend Burning Man as research, or as preparation for telling this story?

MO: I did a lot of research, but unfortunately I haven't been able to go yet. But it is still my mother's dream that we all go with her. Every year she wants to go—she's 76 now, and she's still scheming to find a way to go back!

AC: Does she still have the RV?

MO: We do still have the RV, although we're probably going to sell it very soon, because it is so huge and dangerous to drive. That has not changed! But we almost went last year, the year of the big mud fest, and that would have been hilarious if that was the year that we had gone. That would have been another play! As a family, we're trying to find a way to get there together.

AC: Did you know from the start that this would be a one-woman show in terms of the formal structure of the play? If so, why did you feel that was the form best suited to tell this story?

MO: That's a great question. I think I originally envisioned the show as a oneperson show because one of the initial images that stuck in my mind was the image of my mom as a single little tiny person in the middle of this vast empty desert. The desert provides the most beautiful images of Burning Man— the scale and the size of these minuscule humans in this really incredibly empty space. I think it's a beautiful metaphor for that sense of loneliness and how solitary we are as humans in those moments of grief. As I started to write it, and I started to imagine these other characters, I thought maybe it's more powerful if it's performed through the eyes of this single person experiencing it.

AC: As an actor yourself, have you played the character of Dorothy in any production of the play, or if not, have you considered taking on that role?

MO: Ha! I'm still too young. I'm not 63 yet, so I've got a few more years to go. Honestly, it's been incredibly exciting to be the playwright and the director. I feel like in some ways my role with the story has been to be the caretaker of it, because I'm representing my family and all these people, and they're all real people. I feel that responsibility very heavily on my shoulders, to make sure that it is done in a respectful and truthful way. It has felt really great to kind of be in the driving seat, as playwright and director, and then to invite these incredible actors—like Susinn McFarlen, who is just an amazing performer -to collaborate with me on this. It's been so exciting to invite women actors who are at the height of their powers as performers to come and take on a massive role, a real tourde-force part.

AC: Has your mother attended a performance of the show? If so, what did she make of it?

MO: Yes! She attended a reading on Zoom early on. It was cute because she was very nervous about attending, and so she said, "I don't want to attend on Zoom under my own name." So, we went through this elaborate process of using my husband's Zoom account so that she could sign in as somebody else. We made sure that her screen was off, and my brothers were sitting with her, and I said, "Okay, you're completely anonymous. No one knows you're here." She said, "What if I cry?" And I said, "It's okay. No one will see you and we'll have the microphone off. You can just listen." Then, at intermission they had the chat box open, and when folks started chatting, saying kind things like, "Oh, I'm really enjoying this." My mom got on there and started typing, like, "Hi, everybody! It's me, Dorothy. I'm the real Dorothy." She completely outed herself! In that moment, fear kind of left, and she was in.

In Winnipeg when we premiered the play at the Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre, again, she had that last-minute fear but wanted to come to a preview and said, "I don't want you to tell anybody that it's me." And I said, "Okay, that's going to be weird. They're going to be like, 'Who's that person sitting with Mieko who looks a lot like her?" And she said, "Just tell them I'm your aunt." So, people came to us and asked, "Oh! Is this your mom?" and I'm like, "Nooooo, this is my... Aunt Helen." And they were like, "Okay... sure."

It's been really incredible to have so many people come and want to talk to the two of us, and especially to my mom, to just share their own stories of loss and the journeys that they had gone through. They had such a

sense of kinship with my mom, and it was just so beautiful to see them connecting.

AC: What are you most looking forward to in directing the Arts Club production of *Burning Mom*?

MO: I'm so thrilled to come out to Vancouver and to the Arts Club to build this new production with such a talented team. I've worked in film and TV out there. I've directed workshops, but I haven't directed a full production at a theatre in Vancouver yet. So, I'm really excited to come out as an artist to experience that. The Granville Island Stage is such a beautiful space. It's got such a long history. Ultimately, I'm just excited to meet Vancouverites, to have them encounter the play and my mom and hopefully have some great conversations.

AC: Finally, what do you hope Vancouver audiences will take away from the show?

MO: Well, I think even though the play came out of my dear father's passing, it's become a story about life, about finding that path back to life again. I hope people leave lighter, and with that sense of possibility that they could do something fantastical like what my mom did, because it is totally possible. Her journey inspires me every day, and I hope it inspires them to go and do something that they maybe previously thought was out of reach. I know they can do it.

I contacted Mieko, who I didn't know at the time, and asked her to send me a copy of the script, but alas, it was early days so she wasn't ready to send it out. But here we are, almost 4 years later, and in a few moments I will be standing on the stage in front of you, telling you Mieko's wonderful story. I have to thank my family, especially my best friend and ex, Kevin McNulty, with whom I share two amazing kids, Lucy and Dylan. God knows we tried to keep them from this business, but to no avail. Both of them, all of us now, are trying to make a living telling stories. What can I say—we are the lucky ones. Thanks for coming, and thanks again, Mieko. What a wonderful tribute to your mother you have written.

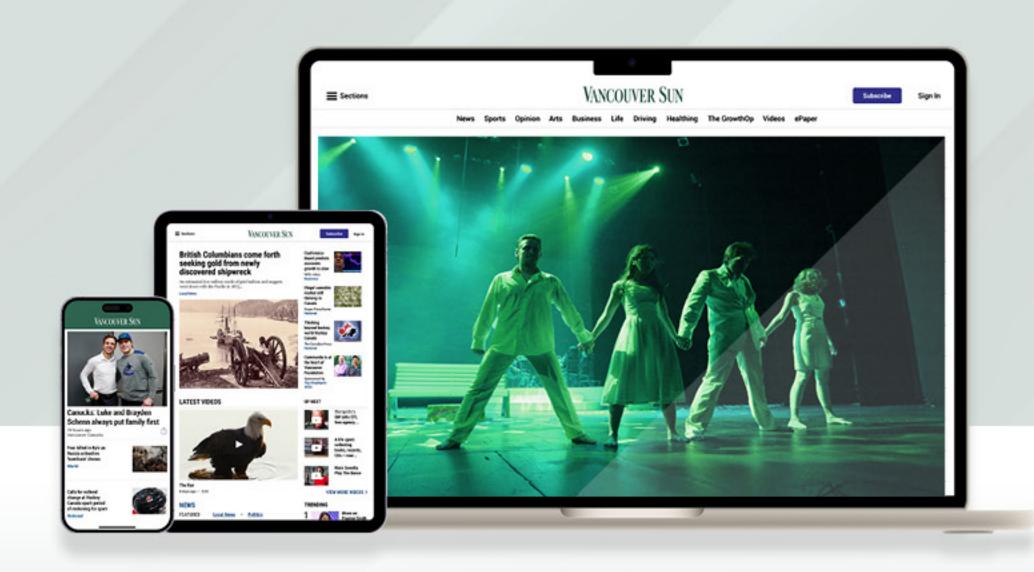

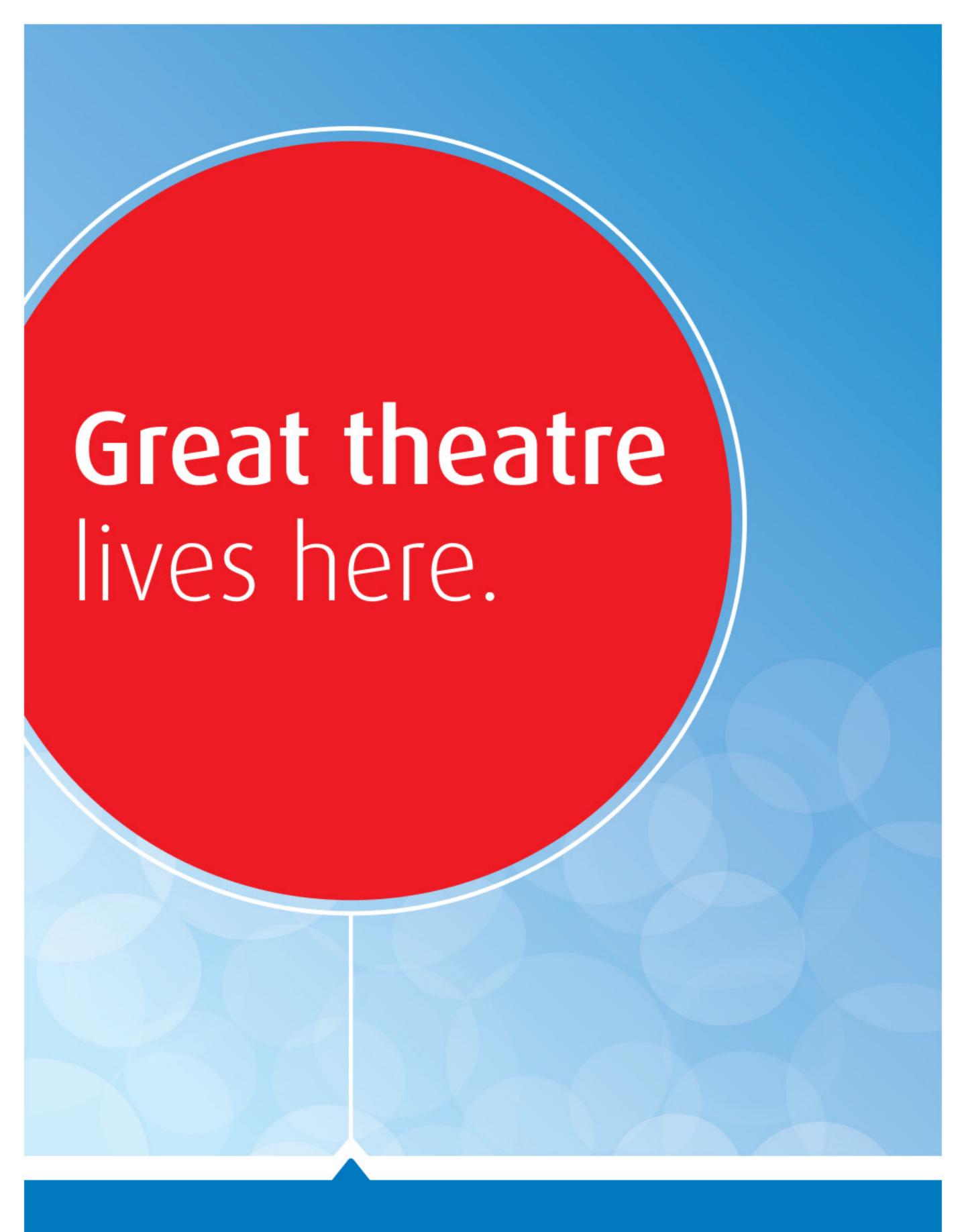
