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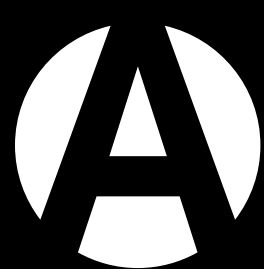

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DIAL M FOR MURDER: A TIMELINE

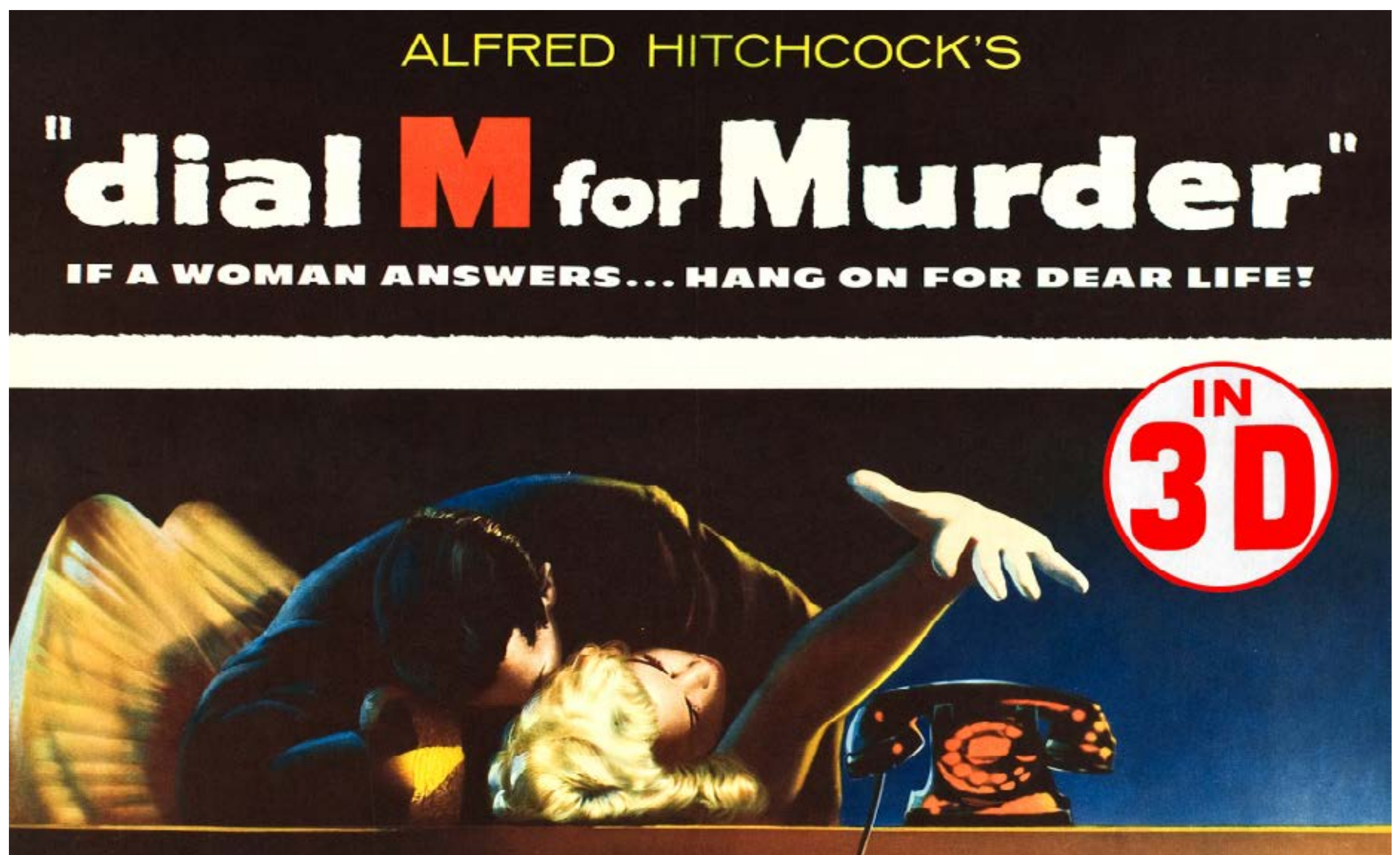

From its inception in 1952, *Dial M for Murder* has been a work straddling stage and screen—first airing on British television, then performed on West End and Broadway stages, followed by a major Hollywood movie. From there followed numerous adaptations and re-imagined versions of Frederick Knott's play, developed for audiences at different times and in different places around the world. This timeline tracks that evolution of Knott's classic thriller over seven decades and across its myriad media forms.

March 1952: *Dial M for Murder* premieres on the BBC television series *Sunday Night Theatre*.

June 1952: Knott's play debuts on stage at London's Westminster Theatre.

October 1952: *Dial M for Murder* opens on Broadway at the Plymouth Theatre, where it runs for over 500 performances.

1954: A film version of *Dial M for Murder*, with a screenplay by Knott, directed by Alfred Hitchcock, and starring Grace Kelly and Ray Milland, opens in May. The film was intended to be presented in 3D, but due to technical complications together with waning popular interest in the novelty of 3D movies, it is instead shown in most theatres in 2D. Hitchcock's film is well received among critics, with Kelly winning Best Actress awards from the National Board of Review and New York Film Critics Circle, and proves a moderate commercial success, grossing \$6.1 million from a budget of 1.4 million. Hitchcock follows *Dial M for Murder* with two subsequent

collaborations with Kelly: *Rear Window* (which opens in theatres just a few months after *Dial M for Murder*) and *To Catch a Thief* (1955). The following year Kelly marries Rainier III, Prince of Monaco and retires from acting. Kelly's films with Hitchcock, and particularly her leading role as Margot Wendice in *Dial M for Murder*, endure as arguably the most iconic work of her relatively brief but indelible career.

1956: *Dial M for Murder* is adapted into a television film that airs on NBC.

1961: Knott returns to the stage with a new crime thriller, *Write Me a Murder*, which premieres on Broadway at the Belasco Theatre.

1966: Knott's play *Wait Until Dark* makes its debut at Broadway's Ethel Barrymore Theatre, with Lee Remick and Robert Duvall in the leading roles. Like *Dial M for Murder*, it is quickly followed by a successful film adaptation, in 1967, directed by Terrence Young and starring Audrey Hepburn and Alan Arkin.

1967: A new made-for-TV film version of *Dial M for Murder*, this time in colour, airs on ABC.

1985: Two different Indian film adaptations of *Dial M for Murder* are released: the Hindi-language *Aitbaar* and the Tamil-language *Saavi*.

1998: *Dial M for Murder* is loosely adapted, and substantially reworked for a late '90s setting, as *A Perfect Murder*, a Hollywood movie directed by Andrew Davis, starring Michael Douglas and Gwyneth Paltrow.

2002: *A Perfect Murder* is itself adapted into the Hindi-language feature *Humraaz*. This Bollywood feature was preceded in 2001 by a Pakistani Urdu-language adaptation of *Dial M for Murder* titled *Khoey Ho Tum Kahan*. This same year, Knott dies at age 86.

2022: Seventy years after its BBC, West End, and Broadway premieres, a new theatrical version of *Dial M for Murder* opens at San Diego's Old Vic Theatre, adapted by Jeffrey Hatcher, following the success of his inventive stage adaptations of classic texts such as Henry James' *The Turn of the Screw*, Robert Louis Stevenson's *Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde*, and the Sherlock Holmes stories of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. This *Dial M for Murder*, retaining the original time and location settings of Knott's play while incorporating a queer twist to the story, is a hit with critics and audiences, inspiring additional stagings elsewhere—now including Vancouver—of Hatcher's version of Knott's play.

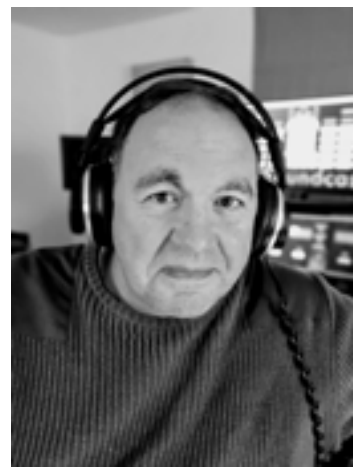

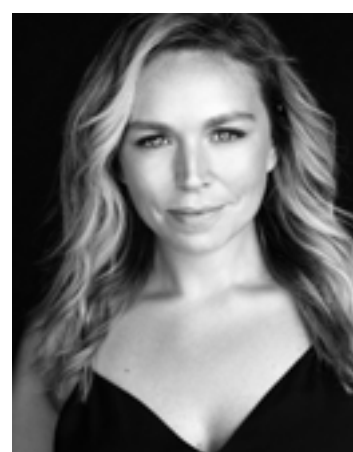

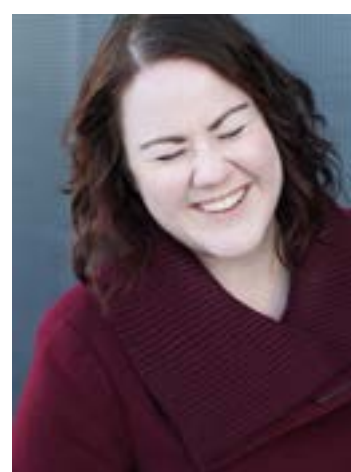
